Repowering the European Energy Sector

**A STRONGER EUROPE
THROUGH SECURE AND SUSTAINABLE
ENERGY SUPPLIES**

Description: The European Union is crossing uncharted territories. After two years of COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent health and economic crises, the year 2022 started with a military conflict at its borders. Consequently, two debates took first stage, namely the most severe energy prices crisis in decades and the high dependence on one major external energy supplier, overlapping with and impacting the Green Deal and the Fit for 55 frameworks.

Representing probably the most ambitious European projects since the inception of the EU, the goals of carbon neutrality by 2050 and the independence from Russian fossil fuels by the end of the decade will seriously test the cohesion among the Member States and the dynamics and adaptability of the 27 energy markets. Consequently, Romanian Energy Day (RED), at its 11th edition, builds upon the European commitment towards accelerating the Green Deal by ramping up renewables and boosting energy efficiency, whilst setting the stage to achieve the independence from certain energy imports. Moreover, RED 2022 highlights Romania's endeavour to strengthen the European energy security by actively diversifying energy sources, resources and transport routes, as well as achieve markets integration by creating an effective link between the South-Eastern and Central European regions.

Ms Ditte Juul Jørgensen became the Director-General for Energy at the European Commission on 1 August 2019. In this capacity, she leads the Directorate-General and its efforts to ensure access to affordable, secure, reliable and clean energy for all Europeans; to promote efficient production and use of energy; and to drive the process of becoming the first climate-neutral continent while contributing to Europe's sustainable growth and job creation.

Before assuming this role, Ms Juul Jørgensen served as the Head of Cabinet for Commissioner Margrethe Vestager. During this time, Ms Juul Jørgensen steered work to ensure that all companies compete equally and fairly on their own merits to benefit consumers, businesses and the European economy as a whole.

A committed civil servant in the European Commission since 1992, Ms Juul Jørgensen also held Head of Unit and Director positions in the Directorate-General for Trade. It was here that she managed European Union policy and

negotiations in the World Trade Organization, provided legal advice and led dispute settlement work. Ms Juul Jørgensen has almost twenty years of experience in multilateral trade policy and World Trade Organization matters. As Head of Unit, she has also worked on sustainable development, sanitary and phytosanitary issues and European Union trade relations with partner countries.

Mr. Zoltan Nagy-Bege has more than 15 years' experience working on energy regulatory activities, as General Director, member of the Regulatory Committee and Vice-president of the Romanian Energy Regulatory Authority (ANRE), responsible for regulations in the fields of electricity, natural gas, thermal power and cogeneration, renewables and energy efficiency.

Since October 2017, Mr. Zoltan Nagy-Bege was appointed as ANRE Vice-President for 5 years term by the Romanian Parliament and he is the Head of the Energy Efficiency Department within ANRE.

ANRE is an autonomous administrative body under Parliamentary control, entirely self-financed and independent as regards its decision-making process, organisation and functioning, whose scope of activity is to issue, approve and monitor the implementation of the national-wide binding regulatory framework required for the proper functioning of the electricity, heat and natural gas sectors and markets in terms of efficiency, competition, transparency and consumer protection.

He graduated the Management at the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration of Babes - Bolyai University from Cluj Napoca in 2000 and took part in several training programs in management like CODECS - The Open University Business School in 2008-2009.

Also graduated, the Energy MBA at the Bucharest University of Economic Studies in 2021.

In the context of the national and European energy and environment targets, Mr. Zoltan Nagy-Bege has carried out an important role regarding the implementation of the current energy legislation and elaborating the secondary regulations, by promoting the best practices and a constructive dialogue with all the stakeholders in the energy regulatory activity and the sustained dissemination of the relevant energy legislation at national and European level, towards improving the environment and the quality of living, as well as achieving sustainable economic growth for the next decades.

Mr. Zoltan Nagy - Bege coordinated, during 2017/2018, the Presidency of the EnR Association - the Association of National Energy Efficiency Agencies in Europe, co-organized, together with European forums, events dedicated to energy efficiency and participated in the elaboration and completion of the National Integrated Plan for Energy and Climate Change 2021-2030, approved for the 5 main dimensions: energy security, decarbonization, energy efficiency, internal energy market and research, innovation and competitiveness.

Victor Negrescu is a Member of the European Parliament, Vice-President of the Committee on Culture and Education (CULT), being part of the Group of the Progressive Alliance of Socialists and Democrats in the European Parliament.

Victor Negrescu has been the rapporteur of the European Parliament for the report on Shaping Digital Education Policy and an active promotor of the allocation of 10% for quality and inclusive education of the National Recovery and Resilience Facilities, as well as 2% to the cultural and creative sector. He managed to obtain in this regard the support of the Budgets Committee members and integrated that in the official position of the European Parliament.

In his activity as MEP, he strongly advocates for consistent investments in education, culture, digitalization and youth, by Member States and the European Commission. He is the MEP with the most significant pilot projects, generating in both mandates initiatives that go up to more than 60 million euros in the fields of education, digitalization, health, entrepreneurship, culture and media.

As Romanian Minister Delegate for European Affairs in 2017-2018, Victor Negrescu was

responsible for the preparations for the Presidency of the European Council, highlighting consistently the importance of the education and digital sectors for Europe.

Victor Negrescu holds an MBA in executive business, a PhD in development cooperation and has accomplished several education programs in prestigious Romanian and international universities and education institutions. In 2009 he started teaching at the Dimitrie Cantemir Christian University in Bucharest and since 2012 he is a lecturer at the National School of Political Science and Public Administration (SNSPA), where he has developed a Master's programme in English on Development, International Cooperation and Humanitarian Aid, as well as two research centres – the Institute for International Cooperation and Development and the Institute for Global Digital Policies. In the same time, he is currently teaching at the University of Saint Louis Brussels. He was also Vice-Rector of SNSPA in 2019, the main responsibility being the coordination of projects and activities aimed at developing the European profile of the university.

Once Romania joined the European Union in 2007, Nicolae started his European career working for the European Parliament in various public policy areas, including budget and agriculture policy, as well as in the area of Transatlantic relations for the European Parliament's Delegation for relations with the United States.

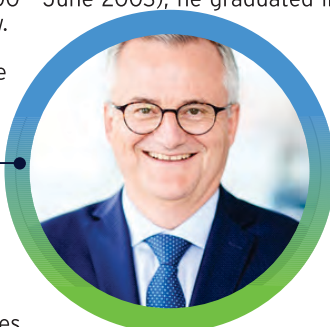

With extensive experience in the Romanian government sector, Mr. Bogdan TONCESCU has been working for NPG Co. Transelectrica SA since 2014, holding the position of Director of the Corporate Governance, Investor Relations and Representation Division. From this position, he coordinated the development of the corporate governance strategy Company-wide.

Between 2008-2014, Mr. TONCESCU worked in the Romanian Government, as an advisor in the structures of several ministries (Ministry of Foreign Affairs; Ministry of European Affairs; Department for European Affairs; Department for Infrastructure Projects and Foreign Investments; Ministry of Transport). Also, between February - August 2012, he held the position of advisor in the Department of International Relations and European Policies within the Presidential Administration. Since 2010, Mr. Bogdan TONCESCU is a member of the New York Bar Association, United States of America (USA). In fact, Mr. TONCESCU began his career in the USA, where he worked as an intern at the Consulate General of Romania in New York and then at the Permanent Mission of Romania to the United Nations (New York), and as a consultant at the World Bank (Washington). A graduate of Binghamton University, State University of New York - Bachelor of Arts in Political Science, International Relations (January 2000 - June 2003), he graduated in 2007 from the Faculty of Law at Hofstra University School of Law. 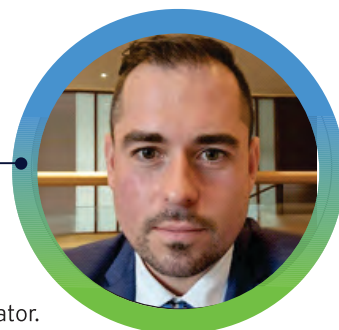

Stable climate for uncertain times", **RED 2021** has been adapted around the European Green Pact and the "Fit for 55" program and attempted to break down the European Union's Climate Action Strategy into its main pillars, namely energy, buildings, transport, industry, as well as the prospects of the Romanian energy industry regarding the transition to low carbon emissions.

Yearly, the CRE association organizes about 10 events/conferences/summits and participates in more than 20 representative events in Bucharest and Brussels.

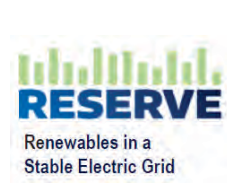
